Year in Review: 2007

This past year was our 35th year in service to our area nursing home residents. We had more than 300 volunteers who provided over 22,000 hours at a value exceeding \$500,000.00.

We have served residents in 21 nursing homes in 6 counties in Arkansas and 3 nursing homes in 2 counties in Oklahoma. These 24 area nursing homes have a bed ca-

pacity of 2,418 and, of course, have turn over during the year. We have visited one-to-one, provided music therapy, pet therapy and assisted residents with bingo, arts and crafts and other group activities.

We participated in the Fort Smith Classic Golf Tournament and held our own first annual Project Compassion Golf Tournament. There were Bunnies at Easter and Hearts of Gold Gifts for residents at Christmas.

We honored LaVerne McCorkle with the Marion Stephens Award, Betty Stutts with the Gloria White Award, and Mary Zimmer with the Sue Sherman Award. Congratulations to you.






